Chris Czopek

More than twenty thousand American Indians served in the Civil War, yet their names have often been left out of the history books. Discover the lost history of Company K and the Civil War story of Michigan's Anishinaabe Sharpshooters with author and historian, Chris Czopek.

Chris has become well known to Michigan historians for his expert research of Civil War soldiers. Called "Lansing's History Detective" by the Lansing State Journal, he has published several books on Civil War history and has been a consultant for The History Channel. Chris is best known as the author of **Who Was Who In Company K**, the first book to give solid facts about Michigan's Native American men who served in the 1st Michigan Sharpshooters.

He is currently involved in projects that will bring the role of Native American soldiers in the Civil War to public attention. He takes great pride in his contribution to the award-winning documentary film **Road To Andersonville**, shown every year in November on PBS television.
